Mrs. FEINSTEIN introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

For the relief of David Bale.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENT STATUS FOR DAVID**
4 **BALE.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding subsections (a)
6 and (b) of section 201 of the Immigration and Nationality
7 Act, David Bale shall be eligible for issuance of an immi-
8 grant visa or for adjustment of status to that of an alien
9 lawfully admitted for permanent residence upon filing an
10 application for issuance of an immigrant visa under sec-
11 tion 204 of such Act or for adjustment of status to lawful
12 permanent resident.

1 (b) ADJUSTMENT OF STATUS.—If David Bale en-
2 tered the United States before the filing deadline specified
3 in subsection (c), he shall be considered to have entered
4 and remained lawfully and shall, if otherwise eligible, be
5 eligible for adjustment of status under section 245 of the
6 Immigration and Nationality Act as of the date of the en-
7 actment of this Act.

8 (c) DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION AND PAYMENT OF
9 FEES.—Subsections (a) and (b) shall apply only if the ap-
10 plication for issuance of an immigrant visa or the applica-
11 tion for adjustment of status are filed with appropriate
12 fees within 2 years after the date of the enactment of this
13 Act.

14 (d) REDUCTION OF IMMIGRANT VISA NUMBER.—
15 Upon the granting of an immigrant visa or permanent res-
16 idence to David Bale, the Secretary of State shall instruct
17 the proper officer to reduce by one, during the current
18 or next following fiscal year, the total number of immi-
19 grant visas that are made available to natives of the coun-
20 try of the alien’s birth under section 203(a) of the Immi-
21 gration and Nationality Act or, if applicable, the total
22 number of immigrant visas that are made available to na-
23 tives of the country of the alien’s birth under section
24 202(e) of such Act.
