# S. 3000

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## AN ACT

To authorize the exchange of land between the Secretary of the Interior and the Director of Central Intelligence at the George Washington Memorial Parkway in McLean, Virginia, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF LAND EXCHANGE.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subject to section 2, the Sec-  
3 retary of the Interior (referred to in this Act as the “Sec-  
4 retary”) and the Director of Central Intelligence (referred  
5 to in this Act as the “Director”) may exchange—

6 (1) approximately 1.74 acres of land under the  
7 jurisdiction of the Department of the Interior within  
8 the boundary of the George Washington Memorial  
9 Parkway, as depicted on National Park Service  
10 Drawing No. 850/81992, dated August 6, 1998; for

11 (2) approximately 2.92 acres of land under the  
12 jurisdiction of the Central Intelligence Agency adja-  
13 cent to the boundary of the George Washington Me-  
14 morial Parkway, as depicted on National Park Serv-  
15 ice Drawing No. 850/81991, sheet 1, dated August  
16 6, 1998.

17 (b) PUBLIC INSPECTION.—The drawings referred to  
18 in subsection (a) shall be available for public inspection  
19 in the appropriate offices of the National Park Service.

20 **SEC. 2. CONDITIONS OF LANDS EXCHANGE**

21 (a) NO REIMBURSEMENT OR CONSIDERATION.—The  
22 exchange described in section 1 shall occur without reim-  
23 bursement or consideration.

24 (b) PUBLIC ACCESS FOR MOTOR VEHICLE TURN-  
25 AROUND.—The Director shall allow public access to the

1 land described in section 1(a)(1) for a motor vehicle turn-  
2 around on the George Washington Memorial Parkway.

3 (c) TURNER-FAIRBANK HIGHWAY RESEARCH CEN-  
4 TER.—The Director shall allow access to the land de-  
5 scribed in section 19(a)(1) by—

6 (1) employees of the Federal Highway Adminis-  
7 tration; and

8 (2) other Federal employees and visitors whose  
9 admission to the Turner-Fairbanks Highway Re-  
10 search Center of the Federal Highway Administra-  
11 tion (hereinafter referred to in this Act as the “Cen-  
12 ter”) is authorized by the Center.

13 (d) CLOSURE TO PROTECT CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE  
14 AGENCY.—

15 (1) IN GENERAL.—Subject to paragraphs (2)  
16 and (3) and notwithstanding any other provision of  
17 this section, the Director may close access to the  
18 land described in section 1(a)(1) to all persons  
19 (other than the United States Park Police, other  
20 necessary employees of the National Park Service,  
21 and employees of the Federal Highway Administra-  
22 tion) if the Director determines that physical secu-  
23 rity conditions require the closure to protect employ-  
24 ees or property of the Central Intelligence Agency.

1           (2) TIME LIMITATION.—The Director may not  
2 close access to the land under paragraph (1) for  
3 more than 12 hours during any 24-hour period un-  
4 less the Director consults with the National Park  
5 Service, the Center, and the United States Park Po-  
6 lice.

7           (3) TURNER-FAIRBANK HIGHWAY RESEARCH  
8 CENTER.—No action shall be taken under this sub-  
9 section to diminish access to the land described in  
10 section 1(a)(1) by employees of the Federal Highway  
11 Administration except when the action is taken for  
12 security reasons.

13          (e) DEED RESTRICTIONS.—The Director shall ensure  
14 compliance by the Central Intelligence Agency with the  
15 deed restrictions that apply to the land described in sec-  
16 tion 1(a)(1).

17          (f) INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT.—The Secretary and  
18 the Director shall comply with the terms and conditions  
19 of the Interagency Agreement between the National Park  
20 Service and the Central Intelligence Agency, signed in  
21 1998, regarding the exchange and management of the  
22 land subject to the Agreement.

23          (g) DEADLINE.—The Secretary and the Director  
24 shall complete the exchange authorized by this section not

1 later than 120 days after the date of enactment of this  
2 Act.

3 **SEC. 3. MANAGEMENT OF EXCHANGED LANDS.**

4 (a) LAND CONVEYED TO SECRETARY.—Any land de-  
5 scribed in section 1(a)(2) that is conveyed to the Secretary  
6 shall be—

7 (1) included within the boundary of the George  
8 Washington Memorial Parkway; and

9 (2) administered by the National Park Service  
10 as part of the Parkway, subject to the laws (includ-  
11 ing regulations) applicable to the Parkway.

12 (b) LAND CONVEYED TO DIRECTOR.—Any land de-  
13 scribed in section 1(a)(1) that is conveyed to the Director  
14 shall be administered as part of the Headquarters Build-  
15 ing Compound of the Central Intelligence Agency.”.
