AN ACT

For the relief of Francis Schochenmaier and Mary Hudson.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. RELIEF OF FRANCES SCHOCHENMAIER.**

4 The Secretary of the Treasury shall pay, out of any
5 moneys in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to
6 Frances Schochenmaier of Bonesteel, South Dakota, the
7 sum of \$60,567.58 in compensation for the erroneous un-
8 derpayment to Herman Schochenmaier, husband of
9 Frances Schochenmaier, during the period from Sep-

1 tember 1945 to March 1995, of compensation and other
2 benefits relating to a service-connected disability incurred
3 by Herman Schochenmaier during military service in
4 World War II.

5 **SEC. 2. RELIEF OF MARY HUDSON.**

6 Notwithstanding section 5121(a) of title 38, United
7 States Code, or any other provision of law, the Secretary
8 of Veterans Affairs shall not recover from the estate of
9 Wallace Hudson, formerly of Russellville, Alabama, or
10 from Mary Hudson, the surviving spouse of Wallace Hud-
11 son, the sum of \$97,253 paid to Wallace Hudson for com-
12 pensation and other benefits relating to a service-con-
13 nected disability incurred by Wallace Hudson during ac-
14 tive military service in World War II, which payment was
15 mailed by the Secretary to Wallace Hudson in January
16 2000 but was delivered after Wallace Hudson's death.

17 **SEC. 3. LIMITATION ON FEES.**

18 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not more than a total of 10 per-
19 cent of the payment required by section 1 or retained
20 under section 2 may be paid to or received by agents or
21 attorneys for services rendered in connection with obtain-
22 ing or retaining such payment, as the case may be, any
23 contract to the contrary notwithstanding.

- 1 (b) VIOLATION.—Any person who violates subsection
- 2 (a) shall be fined not more than \$1,000.
