CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 *Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF NATIONAL SYMPHONY OR-**
4 **CHESTRA CONCERTS ON CAPITOL GROUNDS.**

5 The National Park Service (in this resolution referred
6 to as the “sponsor”) may during each of calendar years
7 1999 and 2000 sponsor a series of three concerts by the
8 National Symphony Orchestra (in this resolution each
9 concert referred to as an “event”) on the Capitol Grounds.
10 Such concerts shall be held on Memorial Day, 4th of July,
11 and Labor Day of each such calendar year, or on such
12 alternate dates during that calendar year as the Speaker
13 of the House of Representatives and the Committee on
14 Rules and Administration of the Senate may jointly des-
15 ignate.

16 **SEC. 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

17 (a) IN GENERAL.—Under conditions to be prescribed
18 by the Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol Police
19 Board, each event authorized by section 1—

1 (b) BROADCASTING OF CONCERTS.—Subject to the
 2 restrictions contained in section 4, the concerts held on
 3 Memorial Day and 4th of July (or their alternate dates)
 4 may be broadcast over radio, television, and other media
 5 outlets.

6 (c) SCHEDULING.—In order to permit the setting up
 7 and taking down of structures and equipment and the con-
 8 ducting of dress rehearsals, the Architect of the Capitol
 9 may permit the sponsor to use the West Central Front
 10 of the United States Capitol for each event for not more
 11 than—

- 12 (1) six days if the concert is televised, and
 13 (2) four days if the concert is not televised.

14 The Architect may not schedule any use under this sub-
 15 section if it would interfere with any concert to be per-
 16 formed by a military band of the United States.

17 (d) ADDITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.—The Architect of
 18 the Capitol and the Capitol Police Board are authorized
 19 to make any such additional arrangements as may be re-
 20 quired to carry out each event.

21 **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

22 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Capitol Police Board shall for
 23 each event—

- 24 (1) provide for all security related needs, and

1 (2) provide for enforcement of the restrictions
2 contained in section 4 of the Act of July 31, 1946
3 (40 U.S.C. 193d; 60 Stat. 718), concerning sales,
4 displays, advertisements, and solicitations on the
5 Capitol Grounds, as well as other restrictions appli-
6 cable to the Capitol Grounds.

7 (b) EXCEPTION FOR CREDIT TO SPONSORS.—Not-
8 withstanding subsection (a), credits may be appropriately
9 given to private sponsors of an event at the conclusion of
10 any broadcast of the event.

11 (c) ENFORCEMENT.—The Architect of the Capitol
12 and the Capitol Police Board shall enter into an agree-
13 ment with the sponsor, and such other persons partici-
14 pating in an event as the Architect of the Capitol and the
15 Capitol Police Board considers appropriate, under which
16 the sponsor and such persons agree to comply with the
17 requirements of this section. The agreement shall specifi-
18 cally prohibit the use for a commercial purpose of any pho-
19 tograph taken at, or broadcast production of, the event.
