Mr. LOTT (for himself and Mr. DASCHLE) submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was considered and agreed to

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To authorize the printing of “The United States Capitol: A Chronicle of Construction, Design, and Politics”.

Whereas the 200th anniversary of the establishment of the seat of government in the District of Columbia will be observed in the year 2000;

Whereas November 17, 2000, will mark the bicentennial of the occupation of the United States Capitol by the Senate and the House of Representatives; and

Whereas the story of the design and construction of the United States Capitol deserves wider attention: Now, therefore, be it

1 **SECTION 1. PRINTING OF “THE UNITED STATES CAPITOL: A**
2 **CHRONICLE OF CONSTRUCTION, DESIGN,**
3 **AND POLITICS”.**

4 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—There shall be printed as a Senate
5 document the book entitled “The United States Capitol:
6 A Chronicle of Construction, Design, and Politics”, pre-
7 pared by the Architect of the Capitol.

8 (b) **SPECIFICATIONS.**—The Senate document de-
9 scribed in subsection (a) shall include illustrations and
10 shall be in the style, form, manner, and binding as di-
11 rected by the Joint Committee on Printing after consulta-
12 tion with the Secretary of the Senate.

13 (c) **NUMBER OF COPIES.**—In addition to the usual
14 number of copies, there shall be printed with suitable bind-
15 ing the lesser of—

16 (1) 6,500 copies for the use of the Senate, the
17 House of Representatives, and the Architect of the
18 Capitol, to be allocated as determined by the Sec-
19 retary of the Senate; or

20 (2) a number of copies that does not have a
21 total production and printing cost of more than
22 \$143,000.
