

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Whereas the 200th anniversary of the establishment of the seat of government in the District of Columbia will be observed in the year 2000;

Whereas November 17, 2000, will mark the bicentennial of the occupation of the United States Capitol by the Senate and the House of Representatives; and

Whereas the story of the design and construction of the United States Capitol deserves wider attention: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. PRINTING OF “THE UNITED STATES CAPITOL: A**
4 **CHRONICLE OF CONSTRUCTION, DESIGN,**
5 **AND POLITICS”.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—There shall be printed as a Senate
7 document the book entitled “The United States Capitol:
8 A Chronicle of Construction, Design, and Politics”, pre-
9 pared by the Architect of the Capitol.

10 (b) SPECIFICATIONS.—The Senate document de-
11 scribed in subsection (a) shall include illustrations and

1 shall be in the style, form, manner, and binding as di-
2 rected by the Joint Committee on Printing after consulta-
3 tion with the Secretary of the Senate.

4 (c) NUMBER OF COPIES.—In addition to the usual
5 number of copies, there shall be printed with suitable bind-
6 ing the lesser of—

7 (1) 6,500 copies for the use of the Senate, the
8 House of Representatives, and the Architect of the
9 Capitol, to be allocated as determined by the Sec-
10 retary of the Senate; or

11 (2) a number of copies that does not have a
12 total production and printing cost of more than
13 \$143,000.
