RESOLUTION

To authorize representation of the Senate Committee on the Judiciary in the case of Philip Tinsley III v. Senate Committee on the Judiciary.

Whereas, in the case of Philip Tinsley III v. Senate Committee on the Judiciary, Civil Action No. 99-952-A, pending in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia, the plaintiff has sued the United States Senate Committee on the Judiciary; and

Whereas, pursuant to sections 703(a) and 704(a)(1) of the Ethics in Government Act of 1978, 2 U.S.C. §§ 288b(a) and 288c(a)(1), the Senate may direct its counsel to defend Senate committees in civil actions: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That the Senate Legal Counsel is directed
2 to represent the Senate Committee on the Judiciary in the
3 case of Philip Tinsley III v. Senate Committee on the Ju-
4 diciary.
