CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of Congress with respect to rights each registered voter in the United States should have.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring)*, That it is the sense of Congress that each
3 registered voter in the United States should have the
4 right—

5 (1) to vote and have his or her vote accurately
6 counted;

1 (2) to cast a vote if he or she is in line when
2 the polls are closing;

3 (3) to ask for and receive assistance in voting;

4 (4) if he or she has voted in error, to at least
5 3 successive opportunities to correct that error
6 through replacement ballots;

7 (5) to an explanation if his or her registration
8 is in question;

9 (6) if his or her registration is in question, to
10 cast a provisional ballot;

11 (7) to prove his or her identity by signing an
12 affidavit if election officials doubt the voter's iden-
13 tity;

14 (8) to written instructions to use when voting,
15 and, upon request, oral instructions in voting from
16 elections officers;

17 (9) to vote free from coercion or intimidation by
18 elections officers or any other person; and

19 (10) to vote on a voting machine that is in
20 working condition and that will allow votes to be ac-
21 curately cast.
