CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the 20th
annual National Peace Officers' Memorial Service.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

1 **SECTION 1. USE OF CAPITOL GROUNDS FOR NATIONAL**
2 **PEACE OFFICERS' MEMORIAL SERVICE.**

3 The National Fraternal Order of Police and its auxil-
4 iary shall be permitted to sponsor a public event, the 20th
5 annual National Peace Officers' Memorial Service, on the
6 Capitol Grounds on May 15, 2001, or on such other date
7 as the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the
8 Committee on Rules and Administration of the Senate
9 may jointly designate, in order to honor the law enforce-
10 ment officers who died in the line of duty during 2000.

11 **SEC. 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

12 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—The event authorized by section
13 1 shall be free of admission charge to the public and ar-
14 ranged not to interfere with the needs of Congress, under
15 conditions to be prescribed by the Architect of the Capitol
16 and the Capitol Police Board.

17 (b) **EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.**—The National
18 Fraternal Order of Police and its auxiliary shall assume
19 full responsibility for all expenses and liabilities incident
20 to all activities associated with the event.

21 **SEC. 3. EVENT PREPARATIONS.**

22 Subject to the approval of the Architect of the Cap-
23 itol, the National Fraternal Order of Police and its auxil-
24 iary are authorized to erect upon the Capitol Grounds
25 such stage, sound amplification devices, and other related

1 structures and equipment, as may be required for the
2 event authorized by section 1.

3 **SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.**

4 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-
5 ment of the restrictions contained in section 4 of the Act
6 of July 31, 1946 (40 U.S.C. 193d; 60 Stat. 718), con-
7 cerning sales, advertisements, displays, and solicitations
8 on the Capitol Grounds, as well as other restrictions appli-
9 cable to the Capitol Grounds, with respect to the event
10 authorized by section 1.
