Mr. JACKSON of Illinois introduced the following joint resolution; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States respecting the right to decent, safe, sanitary, and affordable housing.

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled*
3 *(two-thirds of each House concurring therein),* That the fol-
4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
8 States:

1 “ARTICLE—

2 “SECTION 1. All citizens of the United States shall
3 have a right to decent, safe, sanitary, and affordable hous-
4 ing, which right shall not be denied or abridged by the
5 United States or any State.

6 “SECTION 2. The Congress shall have power to imple-
7 ment this article by appropriate legislation.”.
