## A BILL

To authorize an annual Federal contribution to the District of Columbia to reimburse the District for the costs incurred in providing public safety services for demonstrations and other activities which occur in the District of Columbia because the District is the seat of the Federal Government.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “District of Columbia  
5 Public Safety Reimbursement Act of 2001”.

1 **SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION OF ANNUAL FEDERAL CONTRIBU-**  
2 **TION TO REIMBURSE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA**  
3 **FOR CERTAIN PUBLIC SAFETY COSTS.**

4 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—There are authorized to be appro-  
5 priated to the District of Columbia for fiscal year 2002  
6 and each succeeding fiscal year a contribution towards the  
7 costs incurred by the District of Columbia in the previous  
8 fiscal year in providing public safety and related services  
9 during demonstrations and other events which occur in the  
10 District of Columbia because the District is the seat of  
11 the Federal Government.

12 (b) **DETERMINATION OF AMOUNT OF CONTRIBU-**  
13 **TION.**—The amount of a contribution made under sub-  
14 section (a) shall be based on receipts and other materials  
15 and information presented by the Chief Financial Officer  
16 of the District of Columbia to the Subcommittees on the  
17 District of Columbia of the Committees on Appropriations  
18 of the House of Representatives and Senate.
