AN ACT

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to study the suitability and feasibility of designating the Waco Mammoth Site Area in Waco, Texas, as a unit of the National Park System, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. STUDY AND REPORT REGARDING WACO MAM-**
4 **MOTH SITE AREA.**

5 (a) STUDY.—The Secretary of the Interior, in con-
6 sultation with the State of Texas, the city of Waco, and
7 other appropriate organizations, shall carry out a special

1 resource study regarding the national significance, suit-
2 ability, and feasibility of designating the Waco Mammoth
3 Site Area located in the city of Waco, Texas, as a unit
4 of the National Park System.

5 (b) STUDY PROCESS AND COMPLETION.—Section
6 8(c) of Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5(c)) shall
7 apply to the conduct and completion of the study required
8 by this section.

9 **SEC. 2. SUBMISSION OF STUDY RESULTS.**

10 Not later than 3 years after funds are first made
11 available for this Act, the Secretary shall submit to the
12 Committee on Resources of the House of Representatives
13 and the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources of
14 the Senate a report describing the results of the study.
