Mr. HASTINGS of Washington, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of motions to suspend the rules.

1       *Resolved*, That it shall be in order at any time on  
2 the legislative day of Wednesday, June 6, 2001, for the  
3 Speaker to entertain motions that the House suspend the  
4 rules relating to the following measures:

5           (1) The bill (H.R. 1000) to adjust the boundary  
6 of the William Howard Taft National Historic Site  
7 in the State of Ohio, to authorize an exchange of  
8 land in connection with the historic site, and for  
9 other purposes.

1           (2) The bill (H.R. 37) to amend the National  
2 Trails System Act to update the feasibility and suit-  
3 ability studies of 4 national historic trails and pro-  
4 vide for possible additions to such trails.

5           (3) The bill (H.R. 640) to adjust the bound-  
6 aries of Santa Monica Mountains National Recre-  
7 ation Area, and for other purposes.

8           (4) The bill (H.R. 1661) to extend indefinitely  
9 the authority of the States of Washington, Oregon,  
10 and California to manage a Dungeness crab fishery  
11 until the effective date of a fishery management plan  
12 for the fishery under the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery  
13 Conservation and Management Act.

14           (5) The bill (H.R. 1209) to amend the Immi-  
15 gration and Nationality Act to determine whether an  
16 alien is a child, for purposes of classification as an  
17 immediate relative, based on the age of the alien on  
18 the date the classification petition with respect to  
19 the alien is filed, and for other purposes.

20           (6) The bill (H.R. 1914) to extend for 4 addi-  
21 tional months the period for which chapter 12 of  
22 title 11 of the United States Code is reenacted.

23           (7) The concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res.  
24 150) expressing the sense of Congress that Erik  
25 Weihenmayer's achievement of becoming the first

- 1 blind person to climb Mount Everest demonstrates
- 2 the abilities and potential of all blind people and
- 3 other individuals with disabilities.
