A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to provide that certain sexual crimes against children are predicate crimes for the interception of communications, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Anti-Sexual Predator
5 Act of 2001”.

1 **SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION OF INTERCEPTION OF COMMU-**
2 **NICATIONS IN THE INVESTIGATION OF SEX-**
3 **UAL CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN.**

4 (a) CHILD PORNOGRAPHY.—Section 2516(1)(c) of
5 title 18, United States Code, is amended by inserting “sec-
6 tion 2252A (relating to material constituting or containing
7 child pornography),” after “2252 (sexual exploitation of
8 children),”.

9 (b) TRANSPORTATION FOR ILLEGAL SEXUAL ACTIV-
10 ITY.—Section 2516(1) of title 18, United States Code, is
11 amended—

12 (1) by redesignating paragraph (p), as so redesi-
13 gnated by section 434(2) of the Antiterrorism and
14 Effective Death Penalty Act of 1996 (Public Law
15 104–132; 110 Stat. 1274), as paragraph (q);

16 (2) by striking paragraph (p), as so redesi-
17 gnated by section 201(3) of the Illegal Immigration
18 Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996
19 (division C of Public Law 104–208; 110 Stat. 3009–
20 565); and

21 (3) by inserting after paragraph (o) the fol-
22 lowing:

23 “(p) a violation of section 2422 (relating to
24 coercion and enticement) or section 2423 (relat-
25 ing to transportation of minors) of this title, if,
26 in connection with that violation, the sexual ac-

1 tivity for which a person may be charged with
2 a criminal offense would constitute a felony of-
3 fense under chapter 109A or 110 of this title,
4 if that activity took place within the special
5 maritime and territorial jurisdiction of the
6 United States; or”.
