## A BILL

To extend certain hydro-electric licenses in the State of  
Alaska.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. STAY AND REINSTATEMENT OF FERC LICENSE**

4                       **NO. 11393.**

5       (a) Upon the request of the licensee for FERC  
6       Project No. 11393, the Federal Energy Regulatory Com-  
7       mission shall issue an order staying the license.

8       (b) Upon the request of the licensee for FERC  
9       Project No. 11393, but not later than 6 years after the  
10      date that the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission re-

1 ceives written notice that construction of the Swan-Tyee  
2 transmission line is completed, the Federal Energy Regu-  
3 latory Commission shall issue an order lifting the stay and  
4 make the effective date of the license the date on which  
5 the stay is lifted.

6 (c) Upon request of the licensee for FERC Project  
7 No. 11393 and notwithstanding the time period specified  
8 in section 13 of the Federal Power Act for the commence-  
9 ment of construction, the Commission shall, after reason-  
10 able notice and in accordance with the good faith, due dili-  
11 gence, and public interest requirements of that section, ex-  
12 tend the time period during which licensee is required to  
13 commence the construction of the project for not more  
14 than 3 consecutive 2-year time periods.
