Mr. DORGAN (for himself and Mr. CRAIG) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to eliminate good time credits for prisoners serving a sentence for a crime of violence, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “100 Percent Truth-
5 in-Sentencing Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. ELIMINATION OF CREDIT TOWARD SERVICE OF**
7 **SENTENCE FOR SATISFACTORY BEHAVIOR.**

8 Section 3624(b)(1) of title 18, United States Code,
9 is amended—

1 (1) by striking “(1) Subject to paragraph (2),”
2 and inserting the following:

3 “(1) IN GENERAL.—

4 “(A) GENERAL RULE.—Subject to para-
5 graph (2) and to subparagraph (B) of this
6 paragraph,”;

7 (2) by striking the second sentence; and

8 (3) by adding at the end the following:

9 “(B) CRIMES OF VIOLENCE.—A prisoner
10 who is serving a term of imprisonment of more
11 than 1 year for a crime of violence shall not be
12 eligible for credit toward the service of the pris-
13 oner’s sentence under subparagraph (A).”.
