## A BILL

To enhance penalties for fraud in connection with identifica-  
tion documents that facilitates an act of domestic ter-  
rorism.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Enhanced Penalties  
5       for Enabling Terrorists Act of 2002”.

1 **SEC. 2. PENALTIES FOR FRAUD AND RELATED ACTIVITY IN**  
2 **CONNECTION WITH IDENTIFICATION DOCU-**  
3 **MENTS AND INFORMATION USED IN ACTS OF**  
4 **DOMESTIC TERRORISM.**

5 Section 1028(b)(4) of title 18, United States Code,  
6 is amended—

7 (1) by striking “of this title”; and

8 (2) by inserting before the semicolon the fol-  
9 lowing: “or an act of domestic terrorism (as defined  
10 in section 2331(5))”.

11 **SEC. 3. MANDATORY IMPRISONMENT FOR FRAUD AND RE-**  
12 **LATED ACTIVITY IN CONNECTION WITH IDEN-**  
13 **TIFICATION DOCUMENTS AND INFORMATION**  
14 **USED IN ACTS OF TERRORISM.**

15 Section 1028(b)(4) of title 18, United States Code,  
16 is amended—

17 (1) by striking “or imprisonment” and inserting  
18 “and imprisonment”; and

19 (2) by striking “or both,”.
