A BILL

To suspend temporarily the duty on certain closures for
low expansion laboratory glass.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. STOPPERS, LIDS, AND OTHER CLOSURES.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 99 of
5 the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States is
6 amended by inserting in numerical sequence the following
7 new heading:

“	9902.70.10	Stoppers, lids, and other closures that are made of a low expansion borosilicate glass and alumino-borosilicate glass having a linear coefficient of expansion not exceeding 3.3×10^{-7} per Kelvin within a temperature range of 0° to 300°C, produced by automatic machine (provided for in subheading 7010.20.20) or produced by hand (provided for in subheading 7010.20.30).	Free	No change	No change	On or before 12/31/2007	”.
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1 (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendment made by
2 subsection (a) applies with respect to goods entered, or
3 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after
4 the date that is 15 days after the date of enactment of
5 this Act.

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
