Mr. TORRICELLI (for himself and Mr. CORZINE) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources

A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to study the suitability and feasibility of designating the Abel and Mary Nicholson House, Elsinboro Township, Salem County, New Jersey, as a unit of the National Park System, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Abel and Mary Nichol-
5 son House National Historic Site Study Act of 2001”.

6 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

7 Congress finds that—

1 (1) the Abel and Mary Nicholson House, lo-
2 cated in Elsinboro Township, Salem County, New
3 Jersey, was built in 1722;

4 (2) the original section of the House is the only
5 pristine, surviving portion of a Delaware Valley brick
6 patterned-end house featuring a diaper or diamond
7 pattern in glazed bricks in the gable wall of the
8 building, and less elaborate decorations of checkered
9 string courses on the other 3 walls;

10 (3) the original section of the House—

11 (A) contains early paint, original hinges,
12 locks, shelving, floorboards, roof framing, and
13 chimneypieces; and

14 (B) has received only routine maintenance
15 and no major remodeling, and is without the in-
16 trusion of either electricity or a central heating
17 system;

18 (4) the 1859 addition to the House enhances
19 the significance of the property with a similar level
20 of architectural integrity;

21 (5) the House has well-documented associations
22 with the earliest Quaker settlement in North Amer-
23 ica;

24 (6) the House and surrounding property may
25 be available for acquisition from a willing donor;

1 (7) the House is—

2 (A) 1 of the most significant “first period”
3 houses surviving in the Delaware Valley; and

4 (B) an architectural Rosetta stone on the
5 domestic life of the first 2 generations of set-
6 tlers in the Delaware Valley; and

7 (8) in June 2000, the Secretary designated the
8 House as a National Historic Landmark.

9 **SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.**

10 In this Act:

11 (1) HOUSE.—The term “House” means the
12 Abel and Mary Nicholson House, located in
13 Elsinboro Township, Salem County, New Jersey.

14 (2) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means
15 the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Di-
16 rector of the National Park Service.

17 **SEC. 4. STUDY.**

18 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 3 years after the
19 date on which funds are made available to carry out this
20 Act, the Secretary shall, in consultation with the State of
21 New Jersey—

22 (1) carry out a study on the suitability and fea-
23 sibility of designating the House as a unit of the Na-
24 tional Park System;

1 (2) consider management alternatives to create
2 an administrative association with the New Jersey
3 Coastal Heritage Trail Route; and

4 (3) submit to the Committee on Resources of
5 the House of Representatives and the Committee on
6 Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate a re-
7 port describing the findings of the study.

8 (b) CONTENTS.—The study under subsection (a)
9 shall be conducted in accordance with Public Law 91–383
10 (16 U.S.C. 1a–1 et seq.).

11 **SEC. 5. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

12 There are authorized to be appropriated such sums
13 as are necessary to carry out this Act.

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
