## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing printing of the brochures entitled “How Our Laws Are Made” and “Our American Government”, the publication entitled “Our Flag”, the document-sized, annotated version of the United States Constitution, and the pocket version of the United States Constitution.

1        *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*  
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. HOW OUR LAWS ARE MADE.**

4        (a) IN GENERAL.—An edition of the brochure enti-  
5 tled “How Our Laws Are Made”, as revised under the

1 direction of the Parliamentarian of the House of Rep-  
2 resentatives in consultation with the Parliamentarian of  
3 the Senate, shall be printed as a House document under  
4 the direction of the Joint Committee on Printing.

5 (b) ADDITIONAL COPIES.—In addition to the usual  
6 number, there shall be printed the lesser of—

7 (1) 550,000 copies of the document, of which  
8 440,000 copies shall be for the use of the House of  
9 Representatives, 100,000 copies shall be for the use  
10 of the Senate, and 10,000 copies shall be for the use  
11 of the Joint Committee on Printing; or

12 (2) such number of copies of the document as  
13 does not exceed a total production and printing cost  
14 of \$220,794, with distribution to be allocated in the  
15 same proportion as described in paragraph (1), ex-  
16 cept that in no case shall the number of copies be  
17 less than 1 per Member of Congress.

18 **SEC. 2. OUR AMERICAN GOVERNMENT.**

19 (a) IN GENERAL.—The 2003 revised edition of the  
20 brochure entitled “Our American Government” shall be  
21 printed as a House document under the direction of the  
22 Joint Committee on Printing.

23 (b) ADDITIONAL COPIES.—In addition to the usual  
24 number, there shall be printed the lesser of—

1           (1) 550,000 copies of the document, of which  
2           440,000 copies shall be for the use of the House of  
3           Representatives, 100,000 copies shall be for the use  
4           of the Senate, and 10,000 copies shall be for the use  
5           of the Joint Committee on Printing; or

6           (2) such number of copies of the document as  
7           does not exceed a total production and printing cost  
8           of \$454,160, with distribution to be allocated in the  
9           same proportion as described in paragraph (1), ex-  
10          cept that in no case shall the number of copies be  
11          less than 1 per Member of Congress.

12 **SEC. 3. OUR FLAG.**

13          (a) IN GENERAL.—The 2003 revised edition of the  
14          publication entitled “Our Flag” shall be printed as a  
15          House document under the direction of the Joint Com-  
16          mittee on Printing.

17          (b) ADDITIONAL COPIES.—In addition to the usual  
18          number, there shall be printed the lesser of—

19               (1) 550,000 copies of the document, of which  
20               440,000 copies shall be for the use of the House of  
21               Representatives, 100,000 copies shall be for the use  
22               of the Senate, and 10,000 copies shall be for the use  
23               of the Joint Committee on Printing; or

24               (2) such number of copies of the document as  
25               does not exceed a total production and printing cost

1 of \$198,108, with distribution to be allocated in the  
2 same proportion as described in paragraph (1), ex-  
3 cept that in no case shall the number of copies be  
4 less than 1 per Member of Congress.

5 **SEC. 4. DOCUMENT-SIZED, ANNOTATED UNITED STATES**  
6 **CONSTITUTION.**

7 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—The 2003 edition of the docu-  
8 ment-sized, annotated version of the United States Con-  
9 stitution shall be printed as a House document under the  
10 direction of the Joint Committee on Printing.

11 (b) **ADDITIONAL COPIES.**—In addition to the usual  
12 number, there shall be printed the lesser of—

13 (1) 550,000 copies of the document, of which  
14 440,000 copies shall be for the use of the House of  
15 Representatives, 100,000 copies shall be for the use  
16 of the Senate, and 10,000 copies shall be for the use  
17 of the Joint Committee on Printing; or

18 (2) such number of copies of the document as  
19 does not exceed a total production and printing cost  
20 of \$432,647, with distribution to be allocated in the  
21 same proportion as described in paragraph (1), ex-  
22 cept that in no case shall the number of copies be  
23 less than 1 per Member of Congress.

1 **SEC. 5. POCKET VERSION OF THE UNITED STATES CON-**  
2 **STITUTION.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The 21st edition of the pocket  
4 version of the United States Constitution shall be printed  
5 as a House document under the direction of the Joint  
6 Committee on Printing.

7 (b) ADDITIONAL COPIES.—In addition to the usual  
8 number, there shall be printed the lesser of—

9 (1) 550,000 copies of the document, of which  
10 440,000 copies shall be for the use of the House of  
11 Representatives, 100,000 copies shall be for the use  
12 of the Senate, and 10,000 copies shall be for the use  
13 of the Joint Committee on Printing; or

14 (2) such number of copies of the document as  
15 does not exceed a total production and printing cost  
16 of \$126,729, with distribution to be allocated in the  
17 same proportion as described in paragraph (1), ex-  
18 cept that in no case shall the number of copies be  
19 less than 1 per Member of Congress.
