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## A BILL

To modify the boundary of the Mary McLeod Bethune Council House National Historic Site in Washington, District of Columbia.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This section may be cited as the “Mary McLeod Be-  
5 thune Council House National Historic Site Boundary Ad-  
6 justment Act”.

7 **SEC. 2. BOUNDARY MODIFICATION.**

8 Section 2 of the Act entitled “An Act to authorize  
9 the National Park Service to acquire and manage the  
10 Mary McLeod Bethune Council House National Historic

1 Site, and for other purposes”, approved December 11,  
2 1991 (105 Stat. 1652), is amended—

3 (1) by inserting “(a)” before “The Secretary”;

4 and

5 (2) by adding after subsection (a) (as so des-  
6 igned by paragraph 1 of this section) the following  
7 new subsection:

8 “(b) The Secretary may acquire, with the consent of  
9 the owner thereof, by donation or by purchase with do-  
10 nated or appropriated funds, the abutting property located  
11 at 1320 Vermont Avenue Northwest, Washington, District  
12 of Columbia, and generally depicted on the map entitled  
13 ‘Mary McLead Bethune Council Proposed Boundary Ad-  
14 justment’, numbered 021/80,006, and dated February  
15 2004, to be used for visitor orientation, administrative  
16 purposes, archival storage, facilities for researchers, and  
17 accessibility for handicapped persons.”.

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
