RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1904) to improve the capacity of the Secretary of Agriculture and the Secretary of the Interior to plan and conduct hazardous fuels reduction projects on National Forest System lands and Bureau of Land Management lands aimed at protecting communities, watersheds, and certain other at-risk lands from catastrophic wildfire, to enhance efforts to protect watersheds and address threats to forest

and rangeland health, including catastrophic wildfire, across the landscape, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That upon the adoption of this resolution
2 it shall be in order without intervention of any point of
3 order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 1904) to
4 improve the capacity of the Secretary of Agriculture and
5 the Secretary of the Interior to plan and conduct haz-
6 ardous fuels reduction projects on National Forest System
7 lands and Bureau of Land Management lands aimed at
8 protecting communities, watersheds, and certain other at-
9 risks lands from catastrophic wildfire, to enhance efforts
10 to protect watersheds and address threats to forest and
11 rangeland health, including catastrophic wildfire, across
12 the landscape, and for other purposes. The bill shall be
13 considered as read for amendment. The amendment print-
14 ed in part A of the report of the Committee on Rules ac-
15 companying this resolution shall be considered as adopted.
16 The previous question shall be considered as ordered on
17 the bill, as amended, and on any further amendment
18 thereto to final passage without intervening motion except:
19 (1) one hour of debate on the bill, as amended, with 30
20 minutes equally divided and controlled by the chairman
21 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Agri-
22 culture, 20 minutes equally divided and controlled by the
23 chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee
24 on Resources, and 10 minutes equally divided and con-

1 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of
2 the Committee on the Judiciary; (2) the further amend-
3 ment printed in part B of the report of the Committee
4 on Rules, if offered by Representative George Miller of
5 California or his designee, which shall be in order without
6 intervention of any point of order, shall be considered as
7 read, and shall be separately debatable for one hour equal-
8 ly divided and controlled by the proponent and an oppo-
9 nent; and (3) one motion to recommit with or without in-
10 structions.

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
