Revising the concurrent resolution on the budget for fiscal year 2005, as passed the House.

Mr. OBEY (for himself, Mr. ALLEN, Ms. DELAURO, Mr. EVANS, Mr. FATTAH, Mr. GREEN of Texas, Mr. GRIJALVA, Mr. HOEFFEL, Ms. JACKSON-LEE of Texas, Mr. NADLER, Mr. OLVER, Ms. SCHAKOWSKY, Mr. TIERNEY, and Mr. UDALL of New Mexico) submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on the Budget

RESOLUTION

Revising the concurrent resolution on the budget for fiscal year 2005, as passed the House.

1 *Resolved,*

2 **SECTION 1. BUDGET RESOLUTION REVISIONS.**

3 The following modifications to the concurrent resolu-
4 tion on the budget for fiscal year 2005 given effect as
5 though adopted by the House shall have force and effect
6 in the House as though such modifications were included
7 therein:

8 (1) In the section entitled “**RECOMMENDED**
9 **LEVELS AND AMOUNTS.**”:

1 (A) In the paragraph with the side heading
2 “DEFICITS (ON-BUDGET)”, the amount of the
3 deficit for fiscal year 2005 shall be reduced by
4 \$6,000,000,000.

5 (B) In the paragraph with the side heading
6 “FEDERAL REVENUES”, the recommended level
7 of Federal revenues for fiscal year 2005 shall
8 be increased by \$19,200,000,000 and the
9 amount by which aggregate levels of Federal
10 revenues should be reduced shall be reduced by
11 \$19,200,000,000.

12 (C) In the paragraph with the side heading
13 “NEW BUDGET AUTHORITY” the appropriate
14 level of total new budget authority for fiscal
15 year 2005 shall be increased by
16 \$13,200,000,000.

17 (D) In the paragraph with the side head-
18 ing “BUDGET OUTLAYS” the appropriate level
19 of total budget outlays for fiscal year 2005 shall
20 be increased by \$13,200,000,000.

21 (2) In the section entitled “**MAJOR FUNC-**
22 **TIONAL CATEGORIES.**”:

23 (A) In major functional category National
24 Defense (050) the amounts of new budget au-
25 thority and outlays for fiscal year 2005 shall

1 each be increased by \$1,000,000,000 to im-
2 prove the quality of life and provide livable
3 housing for military personnel and their fami-
4 lies.

5 (B) In major functional category Home-
6 land Security (100) the amounts of new budget
7 authority and outlays for fiscal year 2005 shall
8 each be increased by \$2,000,000,000 to im-
9 prove our hometown response capabilities,
10 strengthen our borders and meet our security
11 mandates.

12 (C) In major functional category Natural
13 Resources and Environment (300) the amounts
14 of new budget authority and outlays for fiscal
15 year 2005 shall each be increased by
16 \$1,000,000,000 to provide clean water and
17 open spaces for future generations.

18 (D) In major functional category Agri-
19 culture (350) the amounts of new budget au-
20 thority and outlays for fiscal year 2005 shall
21 each be increased by \$380,000,000 to inspect
22 and secure our Nation's food supply and to im-
23 prove economic opportunities, infrastructure,
24 and the quality of life for rural Americans.

1 (E) In major functional category Edu-
2 cation, Training, Employment, and Social Serv-
3 ices (500) the amounts of new budget authority
4 and outlays for fiscal year 2005 shall each be
5 increased by \$5,900,000,000 to create opportu-
6 nities for our children and young adults, and to
7 assist the long-term unemployed.

8 (F) In major functional category Health
9 (550) the amounts of new budget authority and
10 outlays for fiscal year 2005 shall each be in-
11 creased by \$1,370,000,000 to provide health
12 care for children and others in need, control in-
13 fectious diseases, foster medical research, and
14 alleviate shortages of nurses and other health
15 professionals.

16 (G) In major functional category Income
17 Security (600) the amounts of new budget au-
18 thority and outlays for fiscal year 2005 shall
19 each be increased by \$250,000,000 to help
20 States provide energy assistance to the poor
21 and alleviate the impact of refugees on State
22 and local communities.

23 (H) In major functional category Veterans
24 Benefits and Series (700) the amounts of new
25 budget authority and outlays for fiscal year

1 2005 shall each be increased by \$1,300,000,000
2 to maintain quality health care for veterans.

3 **SEC. 2. SECTION 302(A) ALLOCATION.**

4 The section 302(a) allocation made to the Committee
5 on Appropriations inserted in the Congressional Record by
6 the chairman of the Committee on the Budget to carry
7 out the concurrent resolution on the budget for fiscal year
8 2005, as passed the House, shall be increased by
9 \$13,200,000,000.

10 **SEC. 3. ADDITIONAL RECONCILIATION INSTRUCTION.**

11 The title of the concurrent resolution on the budget
12 for fiscal year 2005, as passed the House, making rec-
13 onciliation instructions is amended by adding at the end
14 the following new section:

15 **“SEC. ____ . REVENUE RECONCILIATION INSTRUCTION.**

16 The House Committee on Ways and Means shall re-
17 port a reconciliation bill to the House not later than Octo-
18 ber 1, 2004, that consists of changes in laws within its
19 jurisdiction sufficient to increase revenues by
20 \$19,200,000,000.”.

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
