6 “(b) TOP PROGRAM.—There are authorized to be ap-
 7 propriated to the NTIA for grants under the NTIA Tech-
 8 nology Opportunities Program (described in the NTIA no-
 9 tice of availability of funds published on March 17, 2003,
 10 in the Federal Register (68 Fed. Reg. 12678)), including
 11 administrative costs—

12 “(1) \$15,862,000 for fiscal year 2004;

13 “(2) \$16,338,000 for fiscal year 2005;

14 “(3) \$16,828,000 for fiscal year 2006;

15 “(4) \$17,333,000 for fiscal year 2007; and

16 “(5) \$17,852,000 for fiscal year 2008.”.

17 **SEC. 2. PAYMENT FOR SPECTRUM MANAGEMENT FUNC-**
 18 **TIONS.**

19 Section 104 of the National Telecommunications and
 20 Information Administration Organization Act (47 U.S.C.
 21 903) is amended by adding at the end the following:

22 “(f) REIMBURSEMENT FROM FEDERAL AGENCIES.—

23 “(1) FEES FOR COSTS.—Notwithstanding sec-
 24 tion 1535(d) of title 31, United States Code, the
 25 NTIA shall assess against, and collect from, each

1 Federal agency for which the NTIA assigns spec-
2 trum or provides any spectrum management func-
3 tions a charge to cover the costs thereof.

4 “(2) ASSIGNMENT AND MANAGEMENT FUNC-
5 TION CHARGES.—The NTIA may not assign any
6 spectrum for use for, or provide any spectrum man-
7 agement functions with respect to, any Federal
8 agency, except to the extent that the NTIA obtains
9 reimbursement for the costs thereof.”.
