A BILL

To adjust the boundary of Rocky Mountain National Park
in the State of Colorado.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Rocky Mountain Na-
5 tional Park Boundary Adjustment Act of 2004”.

1 **SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.**

2 In this Act:

3 (1) FEDERAL PARCEL.—The term “Federal
4 parcel” means the parcel of approximately 70 acres
5 of Federal land near MacGregor Ranch, Larimer
6 County, Colorado, as depicted on the map.

7 (2) MAP.—The term “map” means the map
8 numbered ~~121/60,467~~, dated ~~September 12, 2003~~
9 *121/80,154, dated June 2004*.

10 (3) NON-FEDERAL PARCELS.—The term “non-
11 Federal parcels” means the 3 parcels of non-Federal
12 land comprising approximately 5.9 acres that are lo-
13 cated near MacGregor Ranch, Larimer County, Col-
14 orado, as depicted on the map.

15 (4) PARK.—The term “Park” means Rocky
16 Mountain National Park in the State of Colorado.

17 **SEC. 3. ROCKY MOUNTAIN NATIONAL PARK BOUNDARY AD-
18 JUSTMENT.**

19 (a) EXCHANGE OF LAND.—

20 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall accept
21 an offer to convey all right, title, and interest in and
22 to the non-Federal parcels to the United States in
23 exchange for the Federal parcel.

24 (2) CONVEYANCE.—Not later than 60 days
25 after the date on which the Secretary receives an
26 offer under paragraph (1), the Secretary shall con-

1 vey the Federal parcel in exchange for the non-Fed-
2 eral parcels.

3 (3) CONSERVATION EASEMENT.—As a condition
4 of the exchange of land under paragraph (2), the
5 Secretary shall reserve a perpetual easement to the
6 Federal parcel for the purposes of protecting, pre-
7 serving, and enhancing the conservation values of
8 the Federal parcel.

9 (b) BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENT; MANAGEMENT OF
10 LAND.—On acquisition of the non-Federal parcels under
11 subsection (a)(2), the Secretary shall—

12 (1) adjust the boundary of the Park to reflect
13 the acquisition of the non-Federal parcels; and

14 (2) manage the non-Federal parcels as part of
15 the Park, in accordance with any laws (including
16 regulations) applicable to the Park.
