## A BILL

3        **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF AUTHORITY FOR THE UNITED**  
4                                    **STATES SUPREME COURT POLICE TO PRO-**

7        Section 6121(b)(2) of title 40, United States Code,  
8        is amended by striking “2004” and inserting “2008”.

1 **SEC. 2. VENUE FOR PROSECUTIONS RELATING TO THE**  
2 **UNITED STATES SUPREME COURT BUILDING**  
3 **AND GROUNDS.**

4 Section 6137 of title 40, United States Code, is  
5 amended by striking subsection (b) and inserting the fol-  
6 lowing:

7 “(b) VENUE AND PROCEDURE.—Prosecution for a  
8 violation described in subsection (a) shall be in the United  
9 States District Court for the District of Columbia or in  
10 the Superior Court of the District of Columbia, on infor-  
11 mation by the United States Attorney or an Assistant  
12 United States Attorney.”.

13 **SEC. 3. GIFTS TO THE UNITED STATES SUPREME COURT.**

14 The Chief Justice or his designee is authorized to ac-  
15 cept, hold, administer, and utilize gifts and bequests of  
16 personal property for the purpose of aiding or facilitating  
17 the work of the United States Supreme Court, but gifts  
18 or bequests of money shall be covered into the Treasury.
