CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the printing of the Biographical Directory of
the United States Congress, 1774–2005.

1 *Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF PRINTING.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—There shall be printed as a Senate
5 document a revised edition of the Biographical Directory
6 of the United States Congress for the period ending with
7 the 108th Congress.

8 (b) SPECIFICATIONS.—The Senate document de-
9 scribed in subsection (a) shall be in the style, form, man-
10 ner, and binding as directed by the Joint Committee on

1 Printing after consultation with the Secretary of the Sen-
2 ate and Clerk of the House of Representatives. The Office
3 of the Secretary of the Senate, acting through the Histo-
4 rian of the Senate, and the Office of the Clerk of the
5 House of Representatives, acting through the Legislative
6 Resource Center, shall provide appropriate biographical
7 data and other material for the revised edition, including
8 data for—

9 (1) Senators and individuals who have served in
10 both the Senate and the House of Representatives,
11 to be provided by the Historian of the Senate; and

12 (2) Members of the House of Representatives
13 (including Delegates and Resident Commissioners),
14 to be provided by the Legislative Resource Center.

15 (c) NUMBER OF COPIES.—In addition to the usual
16 number, there shall be printed with suitable binding the
17 lesser of—

18 (1) 1,230 copies of the revised edition, of which
19 250 shall be for the use of the Senate, 930 copies
20 shall be for the use of the House of Representatives,
21 and 50 copies shall be for the use of the Joint Com-
22 mittee on Printing; or

1 (2) a number of copies that does not have a
2 total production and printing cost of more than
3 \$95,000.

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
