Mr. LINDER (for himself, Mr. KINGSTON, and Mr. WAXMAN) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce

A BILL

To amend the Public Health Service Act with respect to the National Foundation for the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. NATIONAL FOUNDATION FOR CENTERS FOR**
4 **DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION; AC-**
5 **CEPTANCE OF VOLUNTARY SERVICES; FED-**
6 **ERAL FUNDING.**

7 (a) AUTHORITY FOR ACCEPTANCE OF VOLUNTARY
8 SERVICES; STRIKING OF TWO-YEAR LIMIT PER INDI-
9 VIDUAL.—Section 399G(h)(2)(A) of the Public Health
10 Service Act (42 U.S.C. 280e–11(h)(2)(A)) is amended by

1 striking the second sentence and inserting the following:
2 “In the case of an individual, such Director may accept
3 the services provided under the preceding sentence by the
4 individual until such time as the private funding for such
5 individual ends.”.

6 (b) FEDERAL FUNDING.—Section 399G(i) of the
7 Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 280e–11(i)) is
8 amended—

9 (1) in paragraph (2)—

10 (A) in subparagraph (A), by striking
11 “\$500,000” and inserting “\$2,000,000”; and

12 (B) in subparagraph (B), by striking
13 “\$500,000” and inserting “\$2,000,000,”; and

14 (2) by adding at the end the following para-
15 graph:

16 “(4) SUPPORT SERVICES.—The Director of the
17 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention may
18 provide facilities, utilities and support services to the
19 Foundation if it is determined by the Director to be
20 advantageous to the programs of such Centers.”.

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
