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## AN ACT

To require the Secretary of the Treasury to mint coins in commemoration of the bicentennial of the birth of Abraham Lincoln.

1        *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2        *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Abraham Lincoln Com-  
3 memorative Coin Act”.

4 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

5 The Congress finds as follows:

6 (1) Abraham Lincoln, the 16th President, was  
7 one of the Nation’s greatest leaders, demonstrating  
8 true courage during the Civil War, one of the great-  
9 est crises in the Nation’s history.

10 (2) Born of humble roots in present-day LaRue  
11 County, Kentucky, on February 12, 1809, Abraham  
12 Lincoln rose to the Presidency through a combina-  
13 tion of honesty, integrity, intelligence, and commit-  
14 ment to the United States.

15 (3) With the belief that all men were created  
16 equal, Abraham Lincoln led the effort to free all  
17 slaves in the United States.

18 (4) Abraham Lincoln had a generous heart,  
19 with malice toward none and with charity for all.

20 (5) Abraham Lincoln gave the ultimate sacrifice  
21 for his country, dying from an assassin’s bullet on  
22 April 15, 1865.

23 (6) The year 2009 will be the bicentennial anni-  
24 versary of the birth of Abraham Lincoln.

1           (7) The Abraham Lincoln Bicentennial Com-  
2 mission has been charged by Congress with planning  
3 the celebration of Lincoln’s bicentennial.

4           (8) The proceeds from a commemorative coin  
5 will help fund the celebration and the continued  
6 study of the life of Lincoln.

7 **SEC. 3. COIN SPECIFICATIONS.**

8           (a) \$1 SILVER COINS.—The Secretary of the Treas-  
9 ury (hereafter in this Act referred to as the “Secretary”)  
10 shall mint and issue not more than 500,000 \$1 coins,  
11 which shall—

12           (1) weigh 26.73 grams;

13           (2) have a diameter of 1.500 inches; and

14           (3) contain 90 percent silver and 10 percent  
15 copper.

16           (b) LEGAL TENDER.—The coins minted under this  
17 Act shall be legal tender, as provided in section 5103 of  
18 title 31, United States Code.

19           (c) NUMISMATIC ITEMS.—All coins minted under this  
20 Act shall be considered to be numismatic items.

21 **SEC. 4. DESIGN OF COINS.**

22           (a) DESIGN REQUIREMENTS.—

23           (1) IN GENERAL.—The design of the coins  
24 minted under this Act shall be emblematic of the life  
25 and legacy of President Abraham Lincoln.

1           (2) DESIGNATION AND INSCRIPTIONS.—On  
2 each coin minted under this Act there shall be—

3           (A) a designation of the value of the coin;

4           (B) an inscription of the year “2009”; and

5           (C) inscriptions of the words “Liberty”,  
6           “In God We Trust”, “United States of Amer-  
7           ica”, and “E Pluribus Unum”.

8           (b) SELECTION.—The design for the coins minted  
9 under this Act shall be—

10           (1) selected by the Secretary after consultation  
11 with the Commission of Fine Arts and the Abraham  
12 Lincoln Bicentennial Commission; and

13           (2) reviewed by the Citizens Coinage Advisory  
14 Committee.

15 **SEC. 5. ISSUANCE OF COINS.**

16           (a) QUALITY OF COINS.—Coins minted under this  
17 Act shall be issued in uncirculated and proof qualities.

18           (b) MINT FACILITY.—Only 1 facility of the United  
19 States Mint may be used to strike any particular quality  
20 of the coins minted under this Act.

21           (c) PERIOD FOR ISSUANCE.—The Secretary may  
22 issue coins minted under this Act only during the 1-year  
23 period beginning on January 1, 2009.

1 **SEC. 6. SALE OF COINS.**

2 (a) SALE PRICE.—The coins issued under this Act  
3 shall be sold by the Secretary at a price equal to the sum  
4 of—

5 (1) the face value of the coins;

6 (2) the surcharge provided in section 7(a) with  
7 respect to such coins; and

8 (3) the cost of designing and issuing the coins  
9 (including labor, materials, dies, use of machinery,  
10 overhead expenses, marketing, and shipping).

11 (b) BULK SALES.—The Secretary shall make bulk  
12 sales of the coins issued under this Act at a reasonable  
13 discount.

14 (c) PREPAID ORDERS.—

15 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall accept  
16 prepaid orders for the coins minted under this Act  
17 before the issuance of such coins.

18 (2) DISCOUNT.—Sale prices with respect to pre-  
19 paid orders under paragraph (1) shall be at a rea-  
20 sonable discount.

21 **SEC. 7. SURCHARGES.**

22 (a) IN GENERAL.—All sales of coins issued under this  
23 Act shall include a surcharge of \$10 per coin.

24 (b) DISTRIBUTION.—Subject to section 5134(f)(1),  
25 title 31, United States Code, all surcharges received by  
26 the Secretary from the sale of coins issued under this Act

1 shall be promptly paid by the Secretary to the Abraham  
2 Lincoln Bicentennial Commission to further the work of  
3 the Commission.

4 (c) AUDITS.—The Abraham Lincoln Bicentennial  
5 Commission shall be subject to the audit requirements of  
6 section 5134(f)(2) of title 31, United States Code.

7 (d) LIMITATION.—Notwithstanding subsection (a),  
8 no surcharge may be included with respect to the issuance  
9 under this Act of any coin during a calendar year if, as  
10 of the time of such issuance, the issuance of such coin  
11 would result in the number of commemorative coin pro-  
12 grams issued during such year to exceed the annual 2  
13 commemorative coin program issuance limitation under  
14 section 5112(m)(1) of title 31, United States Code (as in  
15 effect on the date of the enactment of this Act). The Sec-  
16 retary of the Treasury may issue guidance to carry out  
17 this subsection.
