## A BILL

To reauthorize and amend the Junior Duck Stamp  
Conservation and Design Program Act of 1994.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Junior Duck Stamp  
5 Reauthorization Amendments Act of 2005”.

1 **SEC. 2. USE OF PROCEEDS FROM LICENSING AND MAR-**  
2 **KETING OF JUNIOR DUCK STAMPS AND JUN-**  
3 **IOR DUCK STAMP DESIGNS.**

4 Section 3(c) of the Junior Duck Stamp Conservation  
5 and Design Program Act of 1994 (16 U.S.C. 719a(c)) is  
6 amended to read as follows:

7 “(c) USE OF PROCEEDS.—Amounts received under  
8 subsection (b)—

9 “(1) shall be available to the Secretary until ex-  
10 pended, without further appropriations, solely for—

11 “(A) awards, prizes, and scholarships to  
12 individuals who submit designs in competitions  
13 under subsection (a), that are—

14 “(i) selected in such a competition as  
15 winning designs; or

16 “(ii) otherwise determined in such a  
17 competition to be superior;

18 “(B) awards and prizes to schools, stu-  
19 dents, teachers, and other participants to fur-  
20 ther education activities related to the conserva-  
21 tion education goals of the Program;

22 “(C) award ceremonies for winners of na-  
23 tional and State Junior Duck Stamp competi-  
24 tions;

1           “(D) travel expenses for winners of na-  
2           tional and State Junior Duck Stamp competi-  
3           tions to award ceremonies, if—

4                   “(i) the event is intended to honor  
5                   students for winning a national competi-  
6                   tion; or

7                   “(ii) the event is intended to honor  
8                   students for winning a State competition;

9           “(E) expenses for licensing and marketing  
10           under subsection (b);

11           “(F) expenses for migratory bird reference  
12           materials or supplies awarded to schools that  
13           participate in the Program; and

14           “(G) expenses for marketing and edu-  
15           cational materials developed to promote the  
16           Program;”.

17 **SEC. 3. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

18           Section 6 of the Junior Duck Stamp Conservation  
19           and Design Program Act of 1994 (16 U.S.C. 719c) is  
20           amended—

21                   (1) by striking “\$250,000” and inserting  
22                   “\$350,000”;

23                   (2) by striking “fiscal years 2001 through  
24                   2005” and inserting “fiscal years 2006 through  
25                   2010”;

1           (3) by inserting “(a) AUTHORIZATION.—” be-  
2 fore the first sentence; and

3           (4) by adding at the end the following:

4           “(b) LIMITATIONS ON USE FOR DISTRIBUTION TO  
5 STATE AND REGIONAL COORDINATORS TO IMPLEMENT  
6 COMPETITIONS.—Of the amount appropriated under this  
7 section for a fiscal year—

8           “(1) not more than \$100,000 may be used by  
9 the Secretary to administer the Program; and

10           “(2) not more than \$250,000 may be distrib-  
11 uted to State and regional coordinators to imple-  
12 ment competitions under the Program.”.

13 **SEC. 4. REPEAL.**

14           The second section 6 of the Junior Duck Stamp Con-  
15 servation and Design Program Act of 1994 (16 U.S.C.  
16 668dd note), relating to an environmental education cen-  
17 ter and refuge headquarters, is repealed.
