Mr. ABERCROMBIE introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure

A BILL

To prohibit the Secretary of Transportation from issuing and enforcing certain requirements relating to commercial motor vehicle drivers.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. LIMITATIONS ON COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LI-**
4 **CENSE REQUIREMENTS.**

5 (a) LIMITATIONS.—The Secretary of Transportation
6 shall not issue or enforce any regulation, guidance, or
7 other requirement that directly or indirectly—

8 (1) prohibits a commercial motor vehicle driver
9 from participating in a driving school in the disposi-
10 tion of a traffic violation;

1 (2) prohibits a State from issuing a provisional
2 driver’s license to a commercial motor vehicle driver
3 in the disposition of a traffic violation; or

4 (3) requires a traffic violation by a commercial
5 motor vehicle driver in a State (other than the driv-
6 er’s licensing State) to be automatically considered
7 a violation, for commercial driver’s license disquali-
8 fication purposes, in the driver’s licensing State.

9 (b) DEFINITIONS.—In this section, the following defi-
10 nitions apply:

11 (1) LICENSING STATE.—The term “licensing
12 State” means, with respect to an individual, a State
13 that issues a commercial driver’s license to the indi-
14 vidual.

15 (2) PROVISIONAL DRIVER’S LICENSE.—The
16 term “provisional driver’s license” means a driver’s
17 license that permits an individual to drive only to
18 and from work and in the scope of employment.
