Mr. UDALL of New Mexico introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce

A BILL

To require the Consumer Product Safety Commission to issue safety standards for lead-containing dishware.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SAFETY STANDARDS FOR LEAD-CONTAINING**
4 **DISHWARE.**

5 Not later than 180 days after the date of the enact-
6 ment of this Act, the Consumer Product Safety Commis-
7 sion shall issue consumer product safety standards, pursu-
8 ant to section 7 of the Consumer Product Safety Act (15
9 U.S.C. 2056), for glassware, dishware, and any other
10 cooking utensil, drinking utensil, or eating utensil con-

1 taining lead. Such standard shall determine the amount
2 of lead in such products that shall be considered haz-
3 ardous and may require labeling of such products or de-
4 clare products containing an unacceptable amount of lead,
5 as determined by the Commission, to be banned hazardous
6 products under section 8 of such Act (15 U.S.C. 2057).
