A BILL

To amend the matching grant program for bulletproof armor vests to eliminate the matching requirement for certain officers.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Wayne ‘Cotton’ Mor-
5 gan Bulletproof Vest Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. AMENDMENT TO MATCHING GRANT PROGRAM FOR**
2 **BULLETPROOF ARMOR VESTS TO ELIMINATE**
3 **MATCHING REQUIREMENT FOR CERTAIN OF-**
4 **FICERS.**

5 Section 2501 of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe
6 Streets Act of 1968 (42 U.S.C. 3796ll) is amended in sub-
7 section (f) by adding at the end the following new para-
8 graph:

9 “(3) NO MATCHING REQUIREMENT FOR CER-
10 TAIN OFFICERS.—Paragraph (1) does not apply to
11 the extent the grant is for the purchase of an armor
12 vest for any officer who works in a high security risk
13 area or for a correctional officer who transports
14 prisoners.”.
