## A BILL

To suspend the visa waiver program until certain entry-exit control requirements are met, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SUSPENSION OF VISA WAIVER PROGRAM.**

4       (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-  
5       sion of law, the visa waiver program established under sec-  
6       tion 217 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.  
7       1187) is hereby suspended until such time as the Sec-  
8       retary of Homeland Security determines and certifies to  
9       Congress that—

1           (1) the automated entry-exit control system au-  
2           thorized under section 110 of the Illegal Immigra-  
3           tion Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of  
4           1996 (8 U.S.C. 1221 note) is fully implemented and  
5           functional;

6           (2) all United States ports of entry have func-  
7           tional biometric machine readers; and

8           (3) all nonimmigrants, including Border Cross-  
9           ing Card holders, are processed through the auto-  
10          mated entry-exit control system.

11          (b) REPEAL.—Subparagraph (B) of section  
12 217(a)(3) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8  
13 U.S.C. 1187(a)(3)) is hereby repealed.
