## A BILL

To amend the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1980 to authorize funding for brownfields revitalization activities and State response programs, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. BROWNFIELDS REVITALIZATION FUNDING.**

4 Section 104(k) of the Comprehensive Environmental  
5 Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1980 (42  
6 U.S.C. 9604(k)) is amended—

1           (1) in paragraph (7)(D) by inserting “and every  
2           4 years thereafter,” after “subsection,”; and

3           (2) by striking paragraph (12) and inserting  
4           the following:

5           “(12) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—  
6           There is authorized to be appropriated to carry out  
7           this subsection \$200,000,000 for each of fiscal years  
8           2002 through 2012.”.

9   **SEC. 2. STATE RESPONSE PROGRAMS.**

10          Section 128(a)(3) of the Comprehensive Environ-  
11          mental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of  
12          1980 (42 U.S.C. 9628(a)(3)) is amended by striking  
13          “2006” and inserting “2012”.
