## A BILL

To repeal the prohibitions on United States assistance to countries that are parties to the International Criminal Court.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. REPEAL OF PROHIBITION ON UNITED STATES**  
4 **MILITARY ASSISTANCE TO PARTIES TO THE**  
5 **INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL COURT.**

6 (a) REPEAL.—Section 2007 of the American  
7 Servicemembers' Protection Act of 2002 (title II of Public  
8 Law 107–206; 22 U.S.C. 7426) is hereby repealed.

9 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The repeal made by sub-  
10 section (a) applies with respect to United States military

1 assistance made available for fiscal year 2007 and each  
2 subsequent fiscal year.

3 **SEC. 2. REPEALS OF LIMITATION ON ECONOMIC SUPPORT**  
4 **FUND ASSISTANCE TO PARTIES TO THE**  
5 **INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL COURT.**

6 (a) REPEALS.—The following provisions of law are  
7 hereby repealed:

8 (1) Section 574 of the Foreign Operations, Ex-  
9 port Financing, and Related Programs Appropria-  
10 tions Act, 2005 (division D of Public Law 108–447).

11 (2) Section 574 of the Foreign Operations, Ex-  
12 port Financing, and Related Programs Appropria-  
13 tions Act, 2006 (Public Law 109–102).

14 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The repeals made by para-  
15 graphs (1) and (2) of subsection (a) apply with respect  
16 to assistance made available under the heading “Economic  
17 Support Fund” in title II of the Foreign Operations, Ex-  
18 port Financing, and Related Programs Appropriations  
19 Act, 2005, and in title II of the Foreign Operations, Ex-  
20 port Financing, and Related Programs Appropriations  
21 Act, 2006, respectively, that are unobligated and unex-  
22 pended as of the date of the enactment of this Act.
