## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2864) to provide for the conservation and development of water and related resources, to authorize the Secretary of the Army to construct various projects for improvements to rivers and harbors of the United States, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of  
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-

1 ation of the bill (H.R. 2864) to provide for the conserva-  
2 tion and development of water and related resources, to  
3 authorize the Secretary of the Army to construct various  
4 projects for improvements to rivers and harbors of the  
5 United States, and for other purposes. The first reading  
6 of the bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order  
7 against consideration of the bill are waived. General de-  
8 bate shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one  
9 hour equally divided and controlled by the chairman and  
10 ranking minority member of the Committee on Transpor-  
11 tation and Infrastructure. After general debate the bill  
12 shall be considered for amendment under the five-minute  
13 rule. It shall be in order to consider as an original bill  
14 for the purpose of amendment under the five-minute rule  
15 the amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended  
16 by the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure  
17 now printed in the bill. The committee amendment in the  
18 nature of a substitute shall be considered as read. All  
19 points of order against the committee amendment in the  
20 nature of a substitute are waived. Notwithstanding clause  
21 11 of rule XVIII, no amendment to the committee amend-  
22 ment in the nature of a substitute shall be in order except  
23 those printed in the report of the Committee on Rules ac-  
24 companying this resolution. Each such amendment may  
25 be offered only in the order printed in the report, may

1 be offered only by a Member designated in the report,  
2 shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time  
3 specified in the report equally divided and controlled by  
4 the proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to  
5 amendment, and shall not be subject to a demand for divi-  
6 sion of the question in the House or in the Committee  
7 of the Whole. All points of order against such amendments  
8 are waived. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill  
9 for amendment the Committee shall rise and report the  
10 bill to the House with such amendments as may have been  
11 adopted. Any Member may demand a separate vote in the  
12 House on any amendment adopted in the Committee of  
13 the Whole to the bill or to the committee amendment in  
14 the nature of a substitute. The previous question shall be  
15 considered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto  
16 to final passage without intervening motion except one  
17 motion to recommit with or without instructions.
