Mr. GINGREY, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 4437) to amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to strengthen enforcement of the immigration laws, to enhance border security, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 4437) to amend the Immigration
6 and Nationality Act to strengthen enforcement of the im-

1 migration laws, to enhance border security, and for other
2 purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed
3 with. All points of order against consideration of the bill
4 are waived. General debate shall be confined to the bill
5 and shall not exceed two hours equally divided among and
6 controlled by the chairman and ranking minority member
7 of the Committee on the Judiciary and the chairman and
8 ranking minority member of the Committee on Homeland
9 Security. After general debate the bill shall be considered
10 for amendment under the five-minute rule. The amend-
11 ment in the nature of a substitute recommended by the
12 Committee on the Judiciary now printed in the bill, modi-
13 fied by the amendment printed in part A of the report
14 of the Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution,
15 shall be considered as adopted in the House and in the
16 Committee of the Whole. The bill, as amended, shall be
17 considered as the original bill for the purpose of further
18 amendment under the five-minute rule and shall be consid-
19 ered as read. All points of order against the bill, as amend-
20 ed, are waived. Notwithstanding clause 11 of rule XVIII,
21 no further amendment to the bill, as amended, shall be
22 in order except those printed in part B of the report of
23 the Committee on Rules. Each further amendment may
24 be offered only in the order printed in the report, may
25 be offered only by a Member designated in the report,

1 shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time
2 specified in the report equally divided and controlled by
3 the proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to
4 amendment, and shall not be subject to a demand for divi-
5 sion of the question in the House or in the Committee
6 of the Whole. All points of order against such further
7 amendments are waived. After disposition of the further
8 amendments printed in part B of the report of the Com-
9 mittee on Rules, the Committee of the Whole shall rise
10 without motion. No further consideration of the bill shall
11 be in order except pursuant to a subsequent order of the
12 House.
