Mr. SESSIONS, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for further consideration of the bill (H.R. 418) to establish and rapidly implement regulations for State driver’s license and identification document security standards, to prevent terrorists from abusing the asylum laws of the United States, to unify terrorism-related grounds for inadmissibility and removal, and to ensure expeditious construction of the San Diego border fence.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of

1 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
2 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for further
3 consideration of the bill (H.R. 418) to establish and rap-
4 idly implement regulations for State driver's license and
5 identification document security standards, to prevent ter-
6 rorists from abusing the asylum laws of the United States,
7 to unify terrorism-related grounds for inadmissibility and
8 removal, and to ensure expeditious construction of the San
9 Diego border fence. No further general debate shall be in
10 order. The bill shall be considered for amendment under
11 the five-minute rule. The amendment printed in part A
12 of the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying
13 this resolution shall be considered as adopted in the House
14 and in the Committee of the Whole. The bill, as amended,
15 shall be considered as the original bill for the purpose of
16 further amendment and shall be considered as read. No
17 further amendment to the bill, as amended, shall be in
18 order except those printed in part B of the report of the
19 Committee on Rules. Each further amendment may be of-
20 fered only in the order printed in the report, may be of-
21 fered only by a Member designated in the report, shall
22 be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time spec-
23 ified in the report equally divided and controlled by the
24 proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to amend-
25 ment, and shall not be subject to a demand for division

1 of the question in the House or in the Committee of the
2 Whole. All points of order against such further amend-
3 ments are waived. At the conclusion of consideration of
4 the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise and re-
5 port the bill, as amended, to the House with such further
6 amendments as may have been adopted. The previous
7 question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and
8 amendments thereto to final passage without intervening
9 motion except one motion to recommit with or without in-
10 structions.
