Ms. EDDIE BERNICE JOHNSON of Texas (for herself, Mr. WILSON of South Carolina, Mr. WELDON of Pennsylvania, and Mr. HALL) submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Education and the Workforce

RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives that a National Historically Black Colleges and Universities Week should be established.

Whereas there are 105 historically Black colleges and universities in the United States;

Whereas historically Black colleges and universities provide the quality education essential to full participation in a complex, highly technological society;

Whereas historically Black colleges and universities have a rich heritage and have played a prominent role in the history of the United States;

Whereas historically Black colleges and universities have allowed many underprivileged students to attain their full potential through higher education;

Whereas the achievements and goals of historically Black colleges and universities are deserving of national recognition; and

Whereas the Senate, in S. Res. 528 passed on July 13, 2006, designated the week beginning September 10, 2006, as “National Historically Black Colleges and Universities Week”: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That the House of Representatives—

2 (1) recognizes the achievements and goals of
3 historically Black colleges and universities in the
4 United States;

5 (2) supports the designation of an appropriate
6 week as “National Historically Black Colleges and
7 Universities Week”; and

8 (3) requests the President to issue a proclama-
9 tion designating such a week, and calling on the peo-
10 ple of the United States and interested groups to ob-
11 serve such week with appropriate ceremonies, activi-
12 ties, and programs to demonstrate support for his-
13 torically Black colleges and universities.
