RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 5970) to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to increase the unified credit against the estate tax to an exclusion equivalent of \$5,000,000, to repeal the sunset provision for the estate and generation-skipping taxes, and to extend expiring provisions, and for other purposes; and consideration of the bill (H.R. 4) to provide economic security for all Americans, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That upon the adoption of this resolution
2 it shall be in order without intervention of any point of
3 order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 5970) to
4 amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to increase the
5 unified credit against the estate tax to an exclusion equiv-
6 alent of \$5,000,000, to repeal the sunset provision for the
7 estate and generation-skipping taxes, and to extend expir-
8 ing provisions, and for other purposes. The bill shall be
9 considered as read. The previous question shall be consid-
10 ered as ordered on the bill to final passage without inter-
11 vening motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally di-
12 vided and controlled by the chairman and ranking minor-
13 ity member of the Committee on Ways and Means; and
14 (2) one motion to recommit.

15 SEC. 2. Upon the adoption of this resolution it shall
16 be in order without intervention of any point of order to
17 consider in the House the bill (H.R. 4) to provide eco-
18 nomic security for all Americans, and for other purposes.
19 The bill shall be considered as read. The previous question
20 shall be considered as ordered on the bill to final passage
21 without intervening motion except: (1) one hour of debate
22 equally divided among and controlled by the chairman and
23 ranking minority member of the Committee on Ways and
24 Means and the chairman and ranking minority member

- 1 of the Committee on Education and the Workforce; and
- 2 (2) one motion to recommit.
