A BILL

To provide that attorneys employed by the Department of Justice shall be eligible for compensatory time off for travel under section 5550b of title 5, United States Code.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. COMPENSATORY TIME OFF FOR TRAVEL.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Attorneys employed by the De-
5 partment of Justice (including assistant United States at-
6 torneys) shall be eligible for compensatory time off for
7 travel under section 5550b of title 5, United States Code,
8 without regard to any provision of section 115 of the De-
9 partments of Commerce, Justice, and State, the Judiciary,

1 and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2000 (as en-
2 acted into law by section 1000(a)(1) of Public Law 106-
3 113 and made permanent by section 111 of Public Law
4 106-553).

5 (b) APPLICABILITY.—Subsection (a) shall apply with
6 respect to time spent in travel status on or after the date
7 of the enactment of this Act.
