AN ACT

To authorize the transfer of naval vessels to certain foreign recipients.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Naval Vessels Transfer
5 Act of 2005”.

1 **SEC. 2. TRANSFERS BY GRANT.**

2 The President is authorized to transfer vessels to for-
3 eign recipients on a grant basis under section 516 of the
4 Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2321j), as fol-
5 lows:

6 (1) GREECE.—To the Government of Greece,
7 the OSPREY class minehunter coastal ship PELI-
8 CAN (MHC-53).

9 (2) EGYPT.—To the Government of Egypt, the
10 OSPREY class minehunter coastal ships CAR-
11 DINAL (MHC-60) and RAVEN (MHC-61).

12 (3) PAKISTAN.—To the Government of Paki-
13 stan, the SPRUANCE class destroyer ship
14 FLETCHER (DD-992).

15 (4) TURKEY.—To the Government of Turkey,
16 the SPRUANCE class destroyer ship CUSHING
17 (DD-985).

18 **SEC. 3. TRANSFERS BY SALE.**

19 The President is authorized to transfer vessels to for-
20 eign recipients on a sale basis under section 21 of the
21 Arms Export Control Act (22 U.S.C. 2761), as follows:

22 (1) INDIA.—To the Government of India, the
23 AUSTIN class amphibious transport dock ship
24 TRENTON (LPD-14).

1 is transferred have such repair or refurbishment of the
2 vessel as is needed before the vessel joins the naval forces
3 of that country be performed at a shipyard located in the
4 United States, including a United States Navy shipyard.

5 **SEC. 7. EXPIRATION OF AUTHORITY.**

6 The authority to transfer a vessel under this section
7 shall expire at the end of the 2-year period beginning on
8 the date of the enactment of this Act.
