## A BILL

To provide for the liquidation or reliquidation of entries of certain manufacturing equipment.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. ENTRY OF CERTAIN MANUFACTURING EQUIP-**

4 **MENT.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding section 514 of  
6 the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1514) or any other pro-  
7 vision of law, the Bureau of Customs and Border Protec-  
8 tion of the Department of Homeland Security shall, not  
9 later than 90 days after the receipt of the request de-

1 scribed in subsection (b), liquidate or reliquidate as free  
2 of duty the entry described in subsection (d).

3 (b) REQUEST.—Liquidation or reliquidation may be  
4 made under subsection (a) with respect to an entry de-  
5 scribed in subsection (d) only if a request therefor is filed  
6 with the Bureau of Customs and Border Protection not  
7 later than 90 days after the date of the enactment of this  
8 Act.

9 (c) REFUND OF AMOUNTS OWED.—Any amounts  
10 owed by the United States pursuant to the liquidation or  
11 reliquidation of the entry described in subsection (d) (in-  
12 cluding interest from the date of entry) shall be refunded  
13 not later than 90 days after the date of such liquidation  
14 or reliquidation.

15 (d) ENTRY.—The entry referred to in subsection (a)  
16 is as follows:
