## A BILL

To provide relief for the Federal judiciary from excessive rent charges.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. RELIEF FROM EXCESSIVE RENT CHARGES.**

4       Section 462 of title 28, United States Code, is  
5       amended by adding at the end the following:

6       “(g) Effective October 1, 2006, rent charges estab-  
7       lished by the Administrator of General Services for accom-

1 modations provided to the judicial branch shall not exceed  
2 the actual costs of operating and maintaining such accom-  
3 modations by the General Services Administration, and no  
4 amounts for shell rent, capital costs, real estate taxes (ex-  
5 cept for taxes actually paid by the Administrator of Gen-  
6 eral Services to lessors), or administrative fees shall be  
7 included in such rent charges. The judicial branch's repay-  
8 ment to the Administrator of General Services of the cost  
9 of repair and alteration projects performed by the General  
10 Services Administration on judicial branch accommoda-  
11 tions after October 1, 2006, shall be recovered over time  
12 in a manner agreed upon by the Director of the Adminis-  
13 trative Office of the United States Courts and the Admin-  
14 istrator.”.
