## A BILL

To amend title 5, United States Code, to exempt certain individuals under the Civil Service Retirement System from the requirement to pay interest on the repayment of amounts received as refunds of retirement contributions as a condition of receiving credit under such System for the service covered by the refund.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2       This Act may be cited as the “CSRS Retirement Re-  
3 payment Technical Correction Act of 2007”.

4 **SEC. 2. EXEMPTION OF CERTAIN INDIVIDUALS FROM RE-**  
5 **QUIREMENT TO PAY INTEREST ON REPAY-**  
6 **MENT OF RETIREMENT CONTRIBUTION RE-**  
7 **FUNDS UNDER CSRS.**

8       (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Section 8334(d)(1) of title 5,  
9 United States Code, is amended by striking “with inter-  
10 est” and inserting the following: “with interest, except  
11 that an employee or Member who received a refund during  
12 the period beginning on October 1, 1990, and ending on  
13 February 28, 1991, may deposit the amount received with-  
14 out interest”.

15       (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendment made by  
16 subsection (a) shall take effect as if included in the enact-  
17 ment of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1990  
18 (Public Law 101–508).
