A BILL

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to proclaim as reservation for the benefit of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians a parcel of land now held in trust by the United States for that Indian tribe.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. LAND TO BE PROCLAIMED RESERVATION.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
5 sion of law, the Secretary of the Interior shall proclaim
6 as reservation for the benefit of the Sault Ste. Marie Tribe
7 of Chippewa Indians the parcel of land now held in trust
8 by the United States and having the legal description as

1 follows: That portion of Section 19, Township 41 North,
2 Range 3 West, Michigan Meridian, described as: All of the
3 NW1/4SW1/4 and all of the S1/2SW1/4 Northerly of a
4 line described as beginning 650 feet Northerly along the
5 centerline of Highway “Mackinac Trail” from the intersec-
6 tion of said centerline with the South Section line of Sec-
7 tion 19, Township 41 North, Range 3 West, thence North-
8 easterly to the Southeast corner of the NW1/4SW1/4 of
9 said Section, containing 65 acres, more or less (except the
10 highway right-of-way and easements of record).

11 (b) APPLICABLE LAW; EFFECTIVE DATE.—The Sec-
12 retary’s proclamation shall be pursuant to section 7 of the
13 Act of June 18, 1934 (25 U.S.C. 467) and shall be
14 deemed effective as of April 19, 1988.
