To amend section 1848 of the Social Security Act to establish standards for growth in Medicare expenditures for physicians' services based on categories of services.

A BILL

To amend section 1848 of the Social Security Act to establish standards for growth in Medicare expenditures for physicians' services based on categories of services.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; TABLE OF CONTENTS.**

4 (a) **SHORT TITLE.**—This Act may be cited as the
5 “Medicare Physician Payment Reform Act of 2007”.

6 (b) **TABLE OF CONTENTS.**—The table of contents of
7 this Act is as follows:

1 **SEC. 2. REFORMING STANDARDS FOR GROWTH IN MEDI-**
 2 **CARE EXPENDITURES FOR PHYSICIANS' AND**
 3 **RELATED SERVICES.**

4 (a) PROVIDING FOR SEPARATE CONVERSION FAC-
 5 TORS FOR SERVICE CATEGORIES.—Subsection (d)(1)(A)
 6 of section 1848 of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
 7 1395w-4) is amended—

8 (1) by designating the sentence beginning “The
 9 conversion factor” as clause (i) with the heading
 10 “YEARS BEFORE 2009” and with appropriate inden-
 11 tation;

12 (2) by inserting “and ending with 2008” after
 13 “beginning with 2001”; and

14 (3) by adding at the end the following new
 15 clause:

16 “(ii) 2009 AND SUBSEQUENT
 17 YEARS.—For years after 2008, the conver-
 18 sion factor for an update service category
 19 (as defined in subsection (j)(5)) for a year
 20 shall be the conversion factor established

1 for such category under this subsection for
2 the previous year (or in the case of 2009,
3 the single conversion factor established
4 under this subsection for 2008), multiplied
5 by the update established under paragraph
6 (8) for such category for the year in-
7 volved.”.

8 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—Such section is
9 further amended—

10 (1) in subsection (b)(1)(B), by inserting “applicable” before “conversion factor”;

12 (2) in subsection (d)(1)(D)—

13 (A) by inserting “before 2009” after “for
14 a year”; and

15 (B) by adding at the end the following:
16 “For 2009 and subsequent years, the separate
17 conversion factor for anesthesia services shall
18 be determined as follows:

19 “(i) For 2009, 46 percent of the sin-
20 gular conversion factor established under this
21 subsection for other physicians’ services for
22 2008, multiplied by the update established
23 under paragraph (8) for the applicable up-
24 date service category for 2009.

1 “(ii) For a subsequent year, the con-
2 version factor established under this sub-
3 section for the previous year, multiplied by
4 the update established under paragraph
5 (8) for the applicable update service cat-
6 egory for the year involved.”;

7 (3) in subsection (d)(1)(E)—

8 (A) in clause (i), by inserting “(or, for
9 publications beginning with 2009, the applicable
10 conversion factor for each update service cat-
11 egory)” after “conversion factor”;

12 (B) in clause (i), by striking “under para-
13 graph (4)” and inserting “(for each update
14 service category for publications beginning with
15 2009)”;

16 (C) in clause (i), by striking “under such
17 paragraph” and inserting “(for each update
18 service category for publications beginning with
19 2008)”;

20 (D) in clause (ii), by inserting “(or, for
21 years beginning with 2008, the service category
22 growth rate and, for years beginning with 2009,
23 the applicable conversion factor, for each up-
24 date service category)” after “sustainable
25 growth rate”; and

1 (4) in subsection (d)(4)—

2 (A) in the heading, by inserting “AND
3 ENDING WITH 2008” after “BEGINNING WITH
4 2001”; and

5 (B) in subparagraph (A), in the matter
6 preceding clause (i), by inserting “and ending
7 with 2008” after “beginning with 2001”.

8 **SEC. 3. ESTABLISHMENT OF UPDATE SERVICE CATEGORIES**
9 **AND EXPENDITURE MEASUREMENT CAT-**
10 **EGORIES.**

11 (a) UPDATE SERVICE CATEGORIES.—Subsection (j)
12 of section 1848 of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
13 1395w-4) is amended by adding at the end the following
14 new paragraph:

15 “(5) UPDATE SERVICE CATEGORIES.—Each of
16 the following categories of physicians’ services shall
17 be treated as a separate ‘update service category’:

18 “(A) Evaluation and management services.

19 “(B) Radiology services and diagnostic
20 tests (other than clinical diagnostic laboratory
21 tests).

22 “(C) Procedures that are subject to a 10-
23 day or 90-day global period (in this paragraph
24 referred to as ‘major procedures’), except that
25 the Secretary may reclassify as minor proce-

1 dures under subparagraph (E) any procedures
2 that would otherwise be included in this cat-
3 egory if the Secretary determines that such pro-
4 cedures are not major procedures.

5 “(D) Anesthesia services that are paid on
6 the basis of the separate conversion factor for
7 anesthesia services determined under subsection
8 (d)(1)(D).

9 “(E) Minor procedures and any other phy-
10 sicians’ services that are not described in a pre-
11 ceding clause.”.

12 (b) EXPENDITURE MEASUREMENT CATEGORY.—
13 Subsection (f)(4) of such section is amended by adding
14 at the end the following new subparagraph:

15 “(D) EXPENDITURE MEASUREMENT CAT-
16 EGORY.—The term ‘expenditure measurement
17 category’ means each of the update service cat-
18 egories described in subparagraphs (A) through
19 (E) of subsection (j)(5) and, only for purposes
20 of reporting, the following additional categories
21 of physicians’ services (as defined in subpara-
22 graph (A)):

23 “(i) Clinical diagnostic laboratory
24 tests.

1 “(ii) Drugs, biologicals, and radio-
2 pharmaceuticals for which payment is
3 made under this part.”.

4 **SEC. 4. ESTABLISHING UPDATES FOR CONVERSION FAC-**
5 **TORS FOR UPDATE SERVICE CATEGORIES.**

6 Section 1848(d) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
7 1395w-4(d)) is amended—

8 (1) in paragraph (4)(C)(iii), by inserting “AND
9 ENDING WITH 2008” and “and ending with 2008”
10 after “BEGINNING WITH 2000” and after “beginning
11 with 2000”, respectively; and

12 (2) by adding at the end the following new
13 paragraph:

14 “(8) UPDATES FOR UPDATE SERVICE CAT-
15 EGORIES FOR YEARS AFTER 2008.—

16 “(A) IN GENERAL.—Unless otherwise pro-
17 vided by law, subject to the budget neutrality
18 factor determined by the Secretary under sub-
19 section (c)(2)(B)(ii), the update to the conver-
20 sion factor for an update service category (as
21 defined in subsection (j)(5)) for a year begin-
22 ning with 2009 is equal to the product of—

23 “(i) 1 plus the Secretary’s estimate of
24 the percentage increase in the MEI (as de-

1 fined in section 1842(i)(3)) for the year;
2 and

3 “(ii) 1 plus the Secretary’s estimate of
4 the update adjustment factor for the up-
5 date service category for the year.

6 “(B) UPDATE ADJUSTMENT FACTORS.—

7 “(i) IN GENERAL.—For purposes of
8 subparagraph (A)(ii), subject to clause
9 (iv), the ‘update adjustment factor’ for an
10 update service category for a year is equal
11 (as estimated by the Secretary) to the sum
12 of—

13 “(I) the prior year adjustment
14 component under clause (ii) for the
15 category and year; and

16 “(II) the cumulative adjustment
17 component under clause (iii) for the
18 category and year.

19 “(ii) PRIOR YEAR ADJUSTMENT COM-
20 PONENT.—The prior year adjustment com-
21 ponent under this clause for an update
22 service category for a year is determined
23 by—

24 “(I) computing the difference
25 (which may be positive or negative)

1 between the amount of allowed ex-
2 penditures (as determined under sub-
3 paragraph (C)) for the corresponding
4 expenditure measurement category for
5 the preceding year (beginning with
6 2008), as determined under clause
7 (v), and the amount of actual expendi-
8 tures for such corresponding expendi-
9 ture measurement category for that
10 year;

11 “(II) dividing that difference by
12 the amount of actual expenditures for
13 such expenditure measurement cat-
14 egory for that year; and

15 “(III) multiplying that quotient
16 by 0.75.

17 “(iii) CUMULATIVE ADJUSTMENT
18 COMPONENT.—The cumulative adjustment
19 component under this clause for an update
20 service category for a year is determined
21 by—

22 “(I) computing the difference
23 (which may be positive or negative)
24 between the amount of allowed ex-
25 penditures for the corresponding ex-

1 penditure measurement category from
2 January 1, 2008, through the end of
3 for the preceding year, as determined
4 under clause (iv), and the amount of
5 actual expenditures for such expendi-
6 ture measurement category for such
7 period;

8 “(II) dividing that difference by
9 the amount of actual expenditures for
10 such expenditure measurement cat-
11 egory for such preceding year as in-
12 creased by the service category growth
13 rate under subsection (f) for the year
14 for which the update adjustment fac-
15 tor is to be determined; and

16 “(III) multiplying that quotient
17 by 0.33.

18 “(iv) RESTRICTION ON UPDATE AD-
19 JUSTMENT FACTORS.—An update adjust-
20 ment factor determined under subpara-
21 graph (B) for an update service category
22 for a year—

23 “(I) may not reduce the update
24 by more than 0.03 or, if greater, the
25 percentage increase in the MEI (as

1 defined in section 1842(i)(3)) for the
2 year (divided by 100); and

3 “(II) may not increase the up-
4 date by more than 0.01.

5 “(v) CORRESPONDING EXPENDITURE
6 MEASUREMENT CATEGORY.—For purposes
7 of this subparagraph, the term ‘cor-
8 responding expenditure measurement cat-
9 egory’ means, with respect to an update
10 service category, the expenditure measure-
11 ment category (as defined in subsection
12 (f)(4)(D)) that includes the services that
13 are included in the update measurement
14 category.

15 “(C) DETERMINATION OF ALLOWED EX-
16 PENDITURES.—

17 “(i) IN GENERAL.—Subject to clause
18 (ii), the allowed expenditures for an ex-
19 penditure measurement category (as de-
20 fined in subsection (f)(4)(D)) for a year
21 (beginning with 2008) is equal to—

22 “(I) for 2008, the actual expendi-
23 tures for services in such category for
24 2007, increased by the service cat-

1 egory growth rate for such category
2 under subsection (f) for 2008; and

3 “(II) for a year after 2008, the
4 amount of allowed expenditures for
5 such category for the preceding year,
6 increased by the service category
7 growth rate determined under sub-
8 section (f) for the year involved.

9 “(ii) ADJUSTMENTS TO ALLOWED EX-
10 PENDITURES.—The Secretary shall, as a
11 part of the annual rule making process for
12 making changes in the fee schedule estab-
13 lished under this section, propose and im-
14 plement adjustments to allowed expendi-
15 tures by expenditure measurement cat-
16 egory to take into account changes in tech-
17 nology and practice patterns, such as
18 changes in the site of service.

19 “(iii) RECALCULATION OF ALLOWED
20 EXPENDITURES.—For purposes of deter-
21 mining the update adjustment factor for
22 an update service category for a year (be-
23 ginning with 2009), the Secretary shall re-
24 compute the allowed expenditures for pre-
25 vious periods beginning on or after Janu-

1 ary 1, 2008, consistent with subsection
2 (f)(3)(D).”.

3 **SEC. 5. REPLACEMENT OF SUSTAINABLE GROWTH RATE**
4 **WITH SERVICE CATEGORY GROWTH RATES.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1848(f) of the Social Se-
6 curity Act (42 U.S.C. 1395w-4(f)) is amended—

7 (1) in the heading, by inserting “AND SERVICE
8 CATEGORY GROWTH RATES” after “SUSTAINABLE
9 GROWTH RATE”;

10 (2) in paragraph (1)—

11 (A) in subparagraph (A), by striking
12 “and” at the end;

13 (B) in subparagraph (B)—

14 (i) by inserting “before 2008” after
15 “each succeeding year”, and

16 (ii) by striking the period at the end
17 and inserting “; and”; and

18 (C) by adding at the end the following new
19 subparagraph:

20 “(C) November 1 of each succeeding year
21 after 2007 the growth rate (in this subsection
22 referred to as ‘service category growth rate’) for
23 each expenditure measurement category for
24 such succeeding year and each of the preceding

1 2 years (or in the case of 2009, the preceding
2 year).”;

3 (3) in paragraph (2)—

4 (A) in the heading, by striking “RATE”
5 and inserting “RATES”;

6 (B) by redesignating subparagraphs (A)
7 through (E) and as clauses (i) through (v), re-
8 spectively, and by designating the sentence be-
9 ginning “The sustainable growth rate” as a
10 subparagraph (A) with the heading “SUSTAIN-
11 ABLE GROWTH RATE FOR PERIODS BEFORE
12 2008” and with appropriate indentation for the
13 subparagraph and its redesignated clauses;

14 (C) by inserting “and before 2008” after
15 “beginning with 2000”; and

16 (D) by adding at the end the following new
17 subparagraph:

18 “(B) SERVICE CATEGORY GROWTH RATES
19 FOR YEARS BEGINNING WITH 2008.—The service
20 category growth rate for an expenditure meas-
21 urement category for a year beginning with
22 2008 shall be equal to the product of—

23 “(i) 1 plus the Secretary’s estimate of
24 the weighted average percentage increase
25 (divided by 100) in the fees for services in

1 the category for the applicable period in-
2 volved;

3 “(ii) 1 plus the Secretary’s estimate of
4 the percentage change (divided by 100) in
5 the average number of individuals enrolled
6 under this part (other than Medicare Ad-
7 vantage plan enrollees) from the previous
8 fiscal year to the applicable period in-
9 volved;

10 “(iii) 1 plus—

11 “(I) 5.1 percentage points (di-
12 vided by 100) in the case of the serv-
13 ice category specified in subsection
14 (j)(5)(A); and

15 “(II) 2.1 percentage points (di-
16 vided by 100) in the case of all other
17 categories; and

18 “(iv) 1 plus the Secretary’s estimate
19 of the percentage change (divided by 100)
20 in expenditures for services in the category
21 in the fiscal year (compared with the pre-
22 vious fiscal year) which will result from
23 changes in law and regulations, taking into
24 account all national coverage determina-
25 tions (as defined in section 1869(f)(1)(B))

1 and any local coverage determinations (as
2 defined in section 1869(f)(2)(B)) with a
3 significant impact on expenditures for phy-
4 sicians' services, but without taking into
5 account estimated changes in expenditures
6 resulting from the update adjustment fac-
7 tor determined under subsection (d)(8)(B),
8 minus 1 and multiplied by 100.”; and

9 (4) in paragraph (3)—

10 (A) in the matter preceding subparagraph
11 (A), by striking “the sustainable growth rates”
12 and inserting “and ending with 2008 and under
13 subsection (d)(8)(B) beginning with 2009, the
14 growth rates”;

15 (B) in subparagraph (C)—

16 (i) in the heading, by inserting “AND
17 BEFORE 2009” after “SUCCEEDING YEARS”;
18 and

19 (ii) in the matter before clause (i), by
20 inserting “and before 2009” after “after
21 2002”; and

22 (C) by inserting after subparagraph (C)
23 the following new subparagraph:

1 priate committees of the Congress not later than 3 months
2 after the end of any year in which the Secretary deter-
3 mines that actual expenditures exceeded allowed expendi-
4 tures for such year and the preceding year for either of
5 the expenditure measurement categories described in
6 clause (i) or (ii) of section 1848(f)(4)(D) of the Social Se-
7 curity Act, as added by section 3(b).

8 (b) RECOMMENDATIONS.—The report submitted
9 under subsection (a) shall include an analysis of the rea-
10 sons for such excess expenditures and recommendations
11 for addressing them in the future.

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
