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## AN ACT

To extend the trade adjustment assistance program under  
the Trade Act of 1974 for 3 months.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. TEMPORARY EXTENSION OF TRADE ADJUST-**  
2 **MENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.**

3 (a) ASSISTANCE FOR WORKERS.—Section 245(a) of  
4 the Trade Act of 1974 (19 U.S.C. 2317(a)) is amended  
5 by striking “September 30, 2007” and inserting “Decem-  
6 ber 31, 2007”.

7 (b) ASSISTANCE FOR FIRMS.—Section 256(b) of the  
8 Trade Act of 1974 (19 U.S.C. 2346(b)) is amended by  
9 inserting after “2007,” the following: “and \$4,000,000 for  
10 the 3-month period beginning on October 1, 2007,”.

11 (c) ASSISTANCE FOR FARMERS.—Section 298(a) of  
12 the Trade Act of 1974 (19 U.S.C. 2401g(a)) is amended  
13 by inserting before the period the following: “, and there  
14 are authorized to be appropriated and there are appro-  
15 priated to the Department of Agriculture to carry out this  
16 chapter \$9,000,000 for the 3-month period beginning on  
17 October 1, 2007”.

18 (d) EXTENSION OF TERMINATION DATES.—Section  
19 285 of the Trade Act of 1974 (19 U.S.C. 2271 note) is  
20 amended by striking “September 30” each place it ap-  
21 pears and inserting “December 31”.

22 (e) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by  
23 this section shall be effective as of October 1, 2007.

24 **SEC. 2. OFFSETS.**

25 (a) TIME FOR PAYMENT OF CORPORATE ESTIMATED  
26 TAXES.—Subparagraph (B) of section 401(1) of the Tax

1 Increase Prevention and Reconciliation Act of 2005 is  
2 amended by striking “114.75 percent” and inserting “115  
3 percent”.

4 (b) CUSTOMS USER FEES.—Section  
5 13031(j)(3)(B)(i) of the Consolidated Omnibus Budget  
6 Reconciliation Act of 1985 (19 U.S.C. 58c(j)(3)(B)(i)) is  
7 amended by striking “September 30, 2014” and inserting  
8 “October 7, 2014”.
