Mr. GEORGE MILLER of California introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Natural Resources

A BILL

To provide for a land exchange involving certain National Forest System lands in the Mendocino National Forest in the State of California, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Deafy Glade Land Ex-
5 change Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. LAND EXCHANGE, MENDOCINO NATIONAL FOREST,**
7 **CALIFORNIA.**

8 (a) LAND EXCHANGE REQUIRED.—If Solano County,
9 California (in this section referred to as the “County”)

1 conveys to the Secretary of Agriculture all right, title, and
2 interest of the County in and to four parcels of land con-
3 sisting of a total of approximately 160 acres identified on
4 the map entitled “Fouts Springs-Deafy Glade Federal and
5 Non-Federal Lands” and dated April 15, 2008, the Sec-
6 retary shall convey to the County, in exchange, all right,
7 title, and interest of the United States in and to the parcel
8 of land in the Mendocino National Forest in the State of
9 California (including any improvements on the land) com-
10 prising approximately 82 acres and known as the Fouts
11 Springs Ranch, as also depicted on the map.

12 (b) AVAILABILITY OF MAP.—The map referred to in
13 subsection (a) shall be on file and available for public in-
14 spection in the Office of the Chief of the Forest Service.

15 (c) LAND EXCHANGE PROCESS.—Section 206 of the
16 Federal Land Policy and Management Act of 1976 (43
17 U.S.C. 1716) shall apply to the land exchange under this
18 section.

19 (d) MANAGEMENT OF ACQUIRED LAND.—The lands
20 acquired by the Secretary under subsection (a) shall be
21 added to and administered as part of the Mendocino Na-
22 tional Forest and managed in accordance with the Act of
23 March 1, 1911 (commonly known as the Weeks Act; 16

1 U.S.C. 480 et seq.) and the laws and regulations applica-
2 ble to the National Forest System.
